Yarrow Hinnant is a life long plant lover, alpinist, backcountry explorer

and forager. He has been gardening and farming for 15 years and has been settled in the Homer area for the past five years. Yarrow

became fascinated with fermentation during his first season working on a small farm in Oregon when Sandor Katz visited the town and gave a two-day workshop on fermentation. Yarrow has been expanding his experiments and learning ever since. Yarrow has been working with plants as a forager and herbalist since the age of 19 and currently produces tinctures, salves, fire ciders, syrups and teas under the brand Fog Yeti.
